# NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

# Pedestrian Bridges over the Speed River linking St. Patrick's Ward to Downtown

### The Study

The City of Guelph (City) has initiated a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for proposed improvements to address the future pedestrian and cyclist traffic demands with two new bridge crossings over the Speed River. The study area is bound by Wellington Street East, Macdonell Street, Guelph Junction Railway (GJR) tracks, Arthur Street South, and includes an area approximately 90 metres south of the existing GJR tracks. The City is proposing to construct one of the bridges immediately south of the GJR tracks to link a future active transportation trail along the GJR tracks from Macdonell to Huron Streets through St. Patrick's Ward. A second pedestrian bridge is proposed within the Study Area located further south along the Speed River to address anticipated increased pedestrian and cycling traffic generated from the Metalworks condominium development on Arthur Street South and other anticipated developments to the east. The site location and approximate extents of the Study Area are shown on the map provided below.

### **The Process**

The Class EA will be conducted as a Schedule 'B' Project in accordance with the "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment" document (Municipal Engineers Association, October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The Class EA process includes public and review agency consultation, an evaluation of alternatives, an assessment of potential environmental impacts of the proposed improvements, and identification of reasonable measures to mitigate any potential adverse impacts.

### **How to Participate**

Later this summer/fall, neighbourhood businesses, residents, community members and interested parties will be invited to attend an open house to review and discuss opportunities and constraints related to the Class EA study. The meeting date and details will be advertised in the *Guelph Mercury Tribune* and on **guelph.ca**. Meeting notices will also be circulated to neighbourhood residents and businesses.



This letter is our response to the Notice of Commencement for the above noted project. This response acknowledges that the City of Guelph has indicated that its study is following the Schedule "B" process under the MEA Class EA in order to assess the future pedestrian and cyclists' needs for a linkage to the downtown Guelph area. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this project. It is understood that tentative locations for the two bridges have been identified.

### Consultation with First Nation and Métis Communities

Your proposed project may have the potential to affect Aboriginal communities who hold or claim Aboriginal or treaty rights protected under Section 35 of Canada's Constitution Act 1982.

The Crown has a duty to consult First Nation and Métis communities when it knows about established or credibly asserted Aboriginal or treaty rights, and contemplates decisions or actions that may adversely affect them.

Although the Crown remains responsible for ensuring the adequacy of consultation with potentially affected Aboriginal communities, it may delegate procedural aspects of the consultation process to project proponents.

The environmental assessment process requires proponents to consult with interested persons and government agencies, including those potentially affected by the proposed project. This includes a responsibility to conduct adequate consultation with First Nation and Métis communities.

The Ministry relies on consultation conducted by proponents when it assesses the Crown's obligations and directs proponents during the regulatory process.

Where the Crown's duty to consult is triggered in relation to your proposed project, the Ontario Ministry of the Environment is delegating the procedural aspects of rights-based consultation to you through this letter.

To assist you in ensuring that these obligations are met, follow-up correspondence identifying the appropriate First Nations and Metis communities for this area will be provided to by the end of this month.

### Source Water Protection

Per the recent amendments to the Municipal Engineers Association (MEA) Class EA parent document approved October 2015, proponents undertaking a Municipal Class EA project must identify early in the process whether a project is occurring within a source water protection vulnerable area. This must be clearly documented in a Project



File report or ESR. If the project is occurring in a vulnerable area, then there may be policies in the local Source Protection Plan (SPP) that need to be adhered to (requirements under the Clean Water Act). The proponent should contact and consult with the appropriate Conservation Authority/Source Protection Authority (CA/SPA) to discuss potential considerations and policies in the SPP that apply to the project.

Please include a section in the report on Source Water Protection. Specifically, it should discuss whether or not the project is located in a vulnerable area and provide applicable details about the area. If located in a vulnerable area, proponents should document whether any project activities are a prescribed drinking water threat and thus pose a risk to drinking water (this should be consulted on with the appropriate CA/SPA). Where an activity poses a risk to drinking water, the proponent must document and discuss in the Project File Report/ESR how the project adheres to or has regard to applicable policies in the local SPP. This section should then be used to inform and should be reflected in other sections of the report, such as the identification of net positive/ negative effects of alternatives, mitigation measures, evaluation of alternatives etc. (As a note, even if the project activities in a vulnerable area are deemed to not to be a drinking water risk, there may be other policies that apply and so consultation with the local CA/SPA is important).

You must contact the Director, Environmental Approvals Branch if you have reason to believe that your proposed project may **adversely affect an Aboriginal or treaty right**, **consultation has reached an impasse**, or if a Part II Order is anticipated. The Ministry will then assess the extent of any Crown duty to consult in the circumstances, and will consider whether additional steps should be taken and what role you will be asked to play in them.

We have now had the opportunity to review the Terms of Reference for a Scoped Environmental Impact Study (EIS) dated June 12, 2016 and we offer the following comments.

- 1. The information provided references the floodplain but does not address potential impacts on flow or hydraulic capacity. This should be addressed concurrently with the EIS or as an independent impact study.
- 2. The GRCA requests to be circulated on the concept plans of the bridge structure to allow for technical comment.

# **Advisory Comments**

- 3. We recommend that the 1-season botanical inventory is expanded to include a spring inventory in addition to the summer inventory.
- 4. The study area for the EIS is identified as all lands occurring 30 meters on each side of the proposed pedestrian bridge and where access is permitted; however, the Tree Preservation Plan only encompasses 15 metres study area on each side of the proposed bridge. It is recommended that the area for tree assessment is consistent with the defined study area of 30 metres on each side of the proposed pedestrian bridge as the final bridge works have not been determined, nor the staging area for construction identified.

# RE: Guelph Pedestrian Bridges Ward to Downtown

Grand River Conservation Authority (GRCA) staff have had an opportunity to review the Guelph Pedestrian Bridges Ward to Downtown Environmental Impact Study (EIS) prepared by Aboud & Associates Inc. (February 14, 2017); the Ward to Downton Bridge Class Environmental Assessment Project File (Schedule B) prepared by GM Blue Plan (February 6, 2017); Conceptual Construction Drawings (August 2016); and the Fluvial Geomorphic Assessment Report prepared by Ecosystem Recovery Inc. dated February 2017, and offer the following comments.

The study area contains the Speed River, the Guelph Special Policy Area floodplain and the regulated allowance adjacent to these features, as well as other natural heritage features as described in the EIS. Due to the presence of the above-noted features a permit from the GRCA is required under *Ontario Regulation 150/06* - Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses Regulation for the proposed bridges.

# **Guelph Pedestrian Bridges Ward to Downtown EIS Comments:**

- 1. The impact assessment outlined in the EIS is sufficient to support the selection of the preferred bridge design and alignment alternatives. The final EIS should include a detailed assessment of potential and residual impacts related to bridge design and construction. It is recommended that site specific impacts and related mitigation measures to be implemented are included in a revised EIS.
- 2. Technical appendices are not attached to the EIS report. The data and information are necessary for the purpose of properly assessing ecological impacts, confirming timing windows, and related mitigation measures such as construction-related setbacks.
- 3. Alternative 1b (between 1a and 1b) is preferred from a regulatory standpoint as the west abutment appears to be farther from the top of bank, this is also consistent with the setbacks recommended in the EIS. The revised EIS should clarify which of the alternatives is selected.

### **Advisory Comments on EIS:**

- 1. It is recommended that the buffer widths outlines in Table 6 are referenced in Table 8 and on the applicable site plans.
- 2. Section 6.2 (Impact Assessment)- Item number 2 indicates the potential impacts are provided in Table 6, however impacts are outlines in Tables 7 and 8.

3. Table 6 and Table 7 do not include "Ecological Linkages" (1.3.5.5)

# Ward to Downtown, Fluvial Geomorphic Assessment Comments:

- 1. Please provide the updated HECRAS model for review
- 2. GRCA would like further details and rational for the changes in the 100 Year and Regional Storm computed water surface elevations along the reach.
- 3. There are concerns with the justification for the changes in the 100 Year and Regional Storm water surface elevations; please provide further justification for the difference between the existing and updated models. Was the channel geometry changed in the updated model, if so were the changes based on field observations?

### Conclusion:

The GRCA continues to have an interest in the ongoing Environmental Assessment for the proposed pedestrian bridges and requests continued involvement in the process.

If the project proceeds after the completion of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessments the following detailed plans will be required by the GRCA at the permitting stage:

- a. Detailed erosion and sediment control plan
- b. Dewatering and diversion plan if applicable
- c. Construction staging and sequencing plan
- d. Site restoration and rehabilitation plan

### Good afternoon Jack,

The primary lines (three at the top of the pole) are 13,860 volt lines. They have to stay a min 3m (10') away from the lines. The next line down is the system neutral, it carries the same clearance. Next line would be street lighting which I believe is a min of 1m (3'). The bottom line looks like Bell or Rogers, not sure on those. Speaking of the lines we do NOT provide cover up as it's a liability thing. We could possibly de-energize that section of line at a cost to be paid by the contractor. This would not be cheap but unfortunately this will be the only way they can work safe at the bridge. The other issue is depending on what our system configuration is at the time of the construction it may be we can't take that section of line down. Our feeders come from four different transformer stations and they are looped together at various points. We have a lot of construction coming up this year which has us rerouting feeder circuits in order for ours to work. We also have to juggle our work areas due to work that Hydro One has going on. They control three of the transformer stations and if they have maintenance going on, they will trump what we do. A lot of things to consider here. This job will all come down to timing. I suggest a meet on site when a successful contractor has been selected.
